### Rev. Leslie Buckner

Founder & President of Bible Way Association

Leslie Buckner, 93, of Doniphan, MO, departed this life Saturday, January 9, 2021 at Sharon Lane Health and Rehab in Shawnee, KS. He was born April 4, 1927 to the

late Charles and Iva (Leslie) Buckner in Oregon County, near the Irish Wilderness on Hurricane Creek.

Reverend Buckner was the Founder and President of Bible Way Association in Doniphan and ministered for over 60 years. He loved the ministry and preaching "The Word". He especially loved preaching and singing at revivals, camp meetings, and youth camps where many souls were saved and filled with the Holy Ghost.

Throughout his ministry, he traveled many miles preaching and traveling to all 50 states. Leslie also was a veteran, having served in the United States Navy Seabees during World War II.

On September 14, 1946 Leslie married Verna Pauline Martin Buckner. Out of this union were six children. Pauline preceded him in death.

On January 8, 2005 Leslie married Margaret Mercer. She survives.

Also, surviving are his children, Brenda Scott of Azle, TX, Paul and wife, Bennie Buckner of High Springs, Fl, and Debbie Washington of Poplar Bluff, MO; daughter-in-law, Debbie Buckner (wife of David) of Doniphan; 16 grandchildren; 42 great-grandchildren; and 18 great-great-grandchildren.

Reverend Buckner was preceded in death by his sons, Leslie "Sonny" Buckner and David Buckner, and his daughter, Carol Gitthens.

Visitation was Friday, January 15, 2021 from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m. and the funeral service was Saturday, January 16, 2021 at 10:00 a.m.

All services were held at Bible Way Association Tabernacle in Doniphan, Missouri.

Rev. Eugene Abrams, Rev. Tommy Williams, and Rev. Ed Luebbering officiated the services. Burial was in the Doniphan City Cemetery with full military honors.

## In Memory Of Rev. Leslie Buckner

#### The Founder Of Bible Way Association

(A Brief History of The Ministry)

Many times new churches are started as the result of disagreements and splits in existing churches. One side will stay and the other side will move off and start another church. Bible Way Association did not start as a split from any other church or organization. Leslie Buckner had only been saved for a few months when he knew God had called him to minister the Gospel of Jesus Christ. In July of 1958, Rev. Leslie and Pauline Buckner organized a prayer meeting in their home in which several people gave their hearts to the Lord. By October of 1958, they became established as a church under the name of Community Fellowship Pentecost Church. From that point on Rev. Leslie and Pauline Buckner were recognized and established as the Founders and leaders of what would become Bible Way Association.

It soon became very evident that the hand of God was upon this little group as it began to grow until it became too big for a living room, and so, they located a store front building where a church had been on 18<sup>th</sup> and Geyer in St. Louis. This building would seat close to 100 people and the church outgrew it within six months.

From that point, many people were being saved and rededicating their lives to Jesus. They then searched for a larger building and found an empty drug store that was located at 12<sup>th</sup> and Sydney. Before long, it became necessary to move again to find another building that could accommodate the growing crowd. They located and rented an old Presbyterian Church at 1614 Menard that would seat over 400 people. The previous church had just built a new church building and moved to their new location. During that two year period of growth, God had added 633 people who were saved or renewed in their walk with God. This was a glorious time of revival!






Within the first year, and after much prayer, the decision was made to start an organization. During April of 1959, the Community Fellowship Pentecost Church became an unincorporated association of ministers and churches, having adopted the organizational name of Community Fellowship Pentecost Ministers and Churches Association.

On July 7, 1960, Judge Waldo C. Mayfield issued the decree making Community Fellowship Pentecost Ministers and Churches Association a body politic and body Corporate under Chapter 352 of the Missouri Statutes.

God began to lead Rev. Buckner to reach out beyond the church with revival services, and it soon became evident that this was the direction God wanted

him to pursue. In 1962, they began to minister revival services in the south central part of Missouri and moved to Winona by early 1963. During the next several years, revival sprang forth across the State of Missouri with hundreds of souls being saved and filled with the Holy Ghost. God moved mightily and blessed the ministry.



In 1965, Rev. Buckner

held a revival at the church in Doniphan, where the Camp Grounds are currently located. After much prayer and confirmation from the Lord, the decision was made to acquire the property.

In the year of 1965, a meeting was held in Poplar Bluff, Missouri by the Board of Directors and the Founders of the Community Fellowship Pentecost Ministers and Churches Association. It was resolved at this meeting to move the central location of this organization from St. Louis, Missouri to Ripley County, Missouri. The petition was made, and the decree was issued and recorded on April 29, 1966 by the presiding Judge, Howard R. Maness in the Ripley County Courthouse in Doniphan, Missouri. This placed the Headquarters



and central office of the Association in Doniphan, Missouri.

Over the years, at the leading of the Lord, the Association was able to acquire the properties that it currently owns where the Headquarters and Camp Grounds are located.

In the early part of 1974, the decision was made by the Board of Directors to change the name of the organization from Community Fellowship Pentecost Ministers and Churches Association to the name which it currently bears, Bible Way Association. This decree was issued on May 7, 1974 by Judge Rex Hinson, and filed and recorded June 18, 1974 at the Ripley County Courthouse in Doniphan, Missouri.

On June 23, 1992, a petition was filed to amend the corporation of Bible Way Association to make important changes as an organization while maintaining its original validity. On July 7, 1992, the decree was issued, filed, and recorded on August 3, 1992.

On November 4, 2002, the final decree was issued establishing the corporation with its current values and as having the same effect and validity as original incorporated by law.

## "Reaching Forth Unto Those Things Which Are Before"

#### Philippians 3:12-14

- 12 Not as though I had already attained, either were already perfect: but I follow after, if that I may apprehend that for which also I am apprehended of Christ Jesus.
- 13 Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended: but *this* one thing *I do*, forgetting those things which are behind, and **reaching forth unto those things which are before**,
- 14 I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, the memory of Rev. Leslie Buckner will always be held dear to our hearts. The recognition of how the Lord has honored and used this Man of God to perform His will during this generation is a true treasure.



It is our heart-felt belief that God has laid a foundation through Brother Buckner. His obedience to the will of God that was strong and enduring. Brother Buckner always returned to the visions God had given him in the beginning of his ministry, as well as those received throughout the 60 years of his ministry keeping everything in alignment with those vision and will of God.

His ministry can never be replaced, and there can never be another Rev. Leslie Buckner to fill God's purpose in his stead.

Brother Buckner's legacy did not end with his journey to heaven, it just launched another phase of the ministry while continuing to fulfil God's original purpose for Bible Way Association. Working together now and into the future, we have the opportunity to reach the ministers, the churches, and the saints to see God manifest His will in our generation.

The greatest thing we can do is <u>reach forward</u> for the same guidance and counsel of the same Holy Ghost while continuing to work at increasing the effectiveness of the various ministries of Bible Way Association.

This Association of churches and ministers was established by the will of God and for God's divine purpose. The true reach and extent of God's vision and purpose for establishing this ministry has not yet been fully realized. To strive for anything less would be forsaking God's purpose for beginning this work.

While we cannot predict everything God has in store for each of us, we do feel very strongly that God has much more work to do. A united effort is needed to perform His divine purpose and will for ministry to the saints in these last days.

- **1 Corinthians 3:9** For we are labourers together with God: ye are God's husbandry, ye are God's building.
- **2 Corinthians 6:1** We then, as workers together with him, beseech you also that ye receive not the grace of God in vain.

While it is necessary to set the Association in order structurally and under new leadership, our purpose and vision has not changed.

1.Our primary focus is to keep the Association doctrinally sound and allow the ministry to operate within those teachings and doctrines. Everything must be centered on the Word of God and the leadership of the Holy Ghost.

- 2. While being consistent with the overall structural vision it may become necessary to adjust minor things operationally to allow for growth and stability, but also to maintain focus for the integrity of the vision.
- 3. As we look forward, we must understand that every detail cannot remain the same in terms of functionality as it was under Rev. Buckner, because "we are not Brother Buckner".

We all have different personalities and characteristics that are unique to our individual relationship with the Lord. Different personnel, but the same Doctrine and the same Spirit. We are facing many different challenges today than we have before.

While we will always honor Brother Buckner, it will be impossible to operate the same and still accomplish what is necessary to overcome new challenges. We cannot walk in his shoes or duplicate his works, but, we can dedicate ourselves to the fulfilment of his God-given visions as we seek to be led by the Spirit.

### **Response To The Challenges Of The Hour**

Covid 19 virus is still a real obstacle although possibly not exactly what it has been portrayed to be. No doubt it has affected the lives of people and their understanding. Fear has gripped the hearts of far too many, thereby limiting possible outreaches. However, God is greater than all obstacles.

Concerning Camp Meetings, we will have a limited 3 day Camp Meeting in June, but looking forward to possibly bringing Camp Meeting services and fellowship services to more localized area where permitted to do so. We are uncertain at this time just what that will look like, but we want the ministry and the people to get involved in the fellowship.

I am reminded of the principles of Brother Buckner's book, "The Bee Theory" which included bringing something in and taking something out. This concept seems very much in tune with this current time and the problems we all face.

We need revival, but it begins in the heart of each of us as members of the body of Christ as we press in to hunger and thirst after God.

Now is the time, if there is truly a desire in our hearts to seek after God, to put our hand to the plow and put our shoulder into the effort to seek the kingdom and God and his righteousness, now is the time to draw nigh to God as he draws nigh to us!
