

The new Sidewalk between the Tabernacle and the Dormitory

As we revealed during the June Camp Meeting, we are working to have the concrete walkway installed. We will be accomplishing this in at least three segments.

- first 1. The segment will be to have the concrete walk poured across the front of the Dormitory along with a new pad of concrete on each end spanning the ends of the building allowing improved for an handicap entrance. In the future, we will also be building a covered area over the doors to protect the entrances, especially during rainy times.
- 2. The second segment of the project will be to pour the concrete



- across the front of the Tabernacle, along with a wooden walkway with handrails, as indicated by the green section in the picture. The wooden section will allow water runoff from the driveway to pass under and into the drainage area.
- 3. If possible, we will endeavor to have this section completed by the September Camp Meeting. However, it may need to be completed after the September Camp Meeting because there is an area of the driveway that goes to the right end of the Dormitory that will have to be filled and leveled to allow the walkway to be easily traversed without being too steep for easy wheelchair access.

We know this will be a significant improvement for everyone who wants to stay in the Dormitory rooms during both Camp Meeting and future Youth Camp Meetings.

<u>Update!</u>

The New Office Building

In the last issue, we gave pictures of the excavation preparing for the new office building. The ground was leveled in preparation for the concrete flooring. We hoped to have the floor poured before the June Camp Meeting but had to wait until the week following the Camp Meeting. Once they started the work, it was finished in just a few days.

They did a beautiful job, and the floor is now ready for construction to begin. We will have the donated lumber for the exterior walls, and the roof structure delivered.

We have calculated the remaining materials needed to complete the job at



today's costs. Unless costs change significantly the estimated remaining costs will be under \$40,000 for the materials, plus any labor costs to complete the building, plus HVAC costs and installation.



Things are beginning to happen, and it's exciting to see what God is doing and where it will lead! Over the past few months, the donations have improved and have become a great benefit to further the improvements of the Camp Grounds.

It's all about the future campground vision to make things more comfortable and accessible for those who will come. We do believe that continued Camp Meetings are the future of this vision.

The **Keepers of the Camp** is a program where people have been giving small monthly donations to

help with cleaning, painting, mowing, and repairs.

Caring people and churches could pledge a monthly donation, or give a one-time donation, to keep these projects moving and improving. God has certainly been providing what is needed, and we believe with your help, His will can be done.

Hindrances To Faith

There are times in our life when it seems like faith does not work. Prayers often go unanswered, and faith is ineffective because there are things in our lives that need to be brought to the Cross. Often during a trial, we err by looking to man's wisdom rather than God's Word for answers to our problems. Man is always ready to give us a reason

not to believe. Most people have a hard enough time believing God for their problems, and they do not have the energy or inclination to stand with someone else to believe God to be delivered from that person's problems that do not even affect their lives. The biblical character Jairus, a ruler in Israel, was forced to come to grips with all these issues in a life and death struggle that resulted in a great miracle for his family. Jairus chose to trust God no matter what his friends said or what the circumstance indicated.

Luke 8:40-41

The word besought here means to "beg." Jairus was passionate in his plea to Jesus. Being a ruler of the synagogue, he put his reputation on the line going to Jesus in the first place, much less openly begging an unpopular figure for an improbable miracle. This Jewish leader humbled himself without thought for his reputation or the opinions of others because he was desperate. People today come to the altar and go away offended after only a few moments if the answer doesn't come right away. They aren't desperate enough, or they haven't come in humility.

A great hindrance to faith is a lack of humility. God doesn't work on our timetable. He seldom answers in the way we want or expect Him to. Therefore we must come to the Lord in times of trial, in fact, *at all times*, with an attitude of complete surrender.

James 4:6 But he giveth more grace. Wherefore he saith, God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble.

Jairus fell at Jesus' feet; he abandoned himself to Jesus and poured out his heart with no reservation or pride. He risked his reputation, forsook his Jewish pride, and cried out in desperation to Jesus for help, and because of this, the Master gave heed to this man's cry.

Isaiah 57:15

Jairus' need was that one of his own household was deathly ill. Some things are easier to believe for than others. The most challenging faith battles are fought in times of crises involving our loved ones, and this was the case for Jairus.

Luke 8:42 For he had one only daughter, about twelve years of age, and she lay a dying. But as he went the people thronged him.

Jairus humbled himself because he knew Jesus was his little girl's only hope. If their problems are not that great, many today tend not to seek as diligently after the Lord, but when their lives fall apart, they come to the Lord humbly, as they should have all along. We need to learn to go to the Lord before we reach the "end of the rope."

The Lord doesn't place a premium on the need for His people to suffer, but often it isn't until suffering comes that we get right with God as we should have all along.

So Jairus had to get desperate before he would finally approach Jesus on terms that God could honor and bring glory to His name by answering the man's prayer.

Interestingly enough, we find that while Jairus, desperate and in near panic, is expecting Jesus to come to his aid, another gets Jesus' attention first. This points up another obstacle or hindrance to faith, which is maintaining patience and compassion for others while waiting on our answer.

Luke 8:43

Jesus had gone with Jairus willingly, but a great crowd pressed in with many needs. There was no question in Jesus' actions that He would go and heal the little girl. Jesus was the answer to Jairus' need, and with every footstep Jesus took on the journey, the answer was on the way, but then other people with problems got in the way. Jesus finally detoured altogether and stopped to meet the need of this poor woman with the issue of blood.

Just imagine the impatience that Jairus must have felt. He no doubt stood there, shifting from one foot to the other, willing Jesus to hurry up and meet *his* need. In a time of waiting for our answer, we must have patience and love for our fellow man. If we cannot get our minds off ourselves and rejoice to see another person's need met (even when our need seems so much more urgent), we have yet to learn the depths of God's love. If we do not understand God's love, our faith can not work. Faith and love work hand in hand.

Galatians 5:6 For in Jesus Christ neither circumcision availeth any thing, nor uncircumcision; but faith which worketh by love.

Faith will not work without love. Love will not prevail without patience. How can we expect God to work a miracle in our life when we begrudge the blessings He is pouring out on others who may seem (to us)

less deserving? Now this woman with the issue of blood was ill, to be sure, but Jairus' situation was a life and death matter. No doubt Jairus was under intense stress at the time, but he kept silent and waited on the Master. Jesus was his only hope. This is another great hindrance to faith, the lack of determination. Jairus could have left Jesus with the woman there and gone to look for a physician or someone else to meet their need. Many people today are very weak on this point. They pray and believe, and then a short while later, they give up and turn to someone or something else to find an answer. We must use wisdom in these matters, but we must also learn to trust in the Lord and wait patiently on his answer.

Ecclesiastes 7:8 Better is the end of a thing than the beginning thereof: and the patient in spirit is better than the proud in spirit.

As Jairus waited on the Lord, the unthinkable happened. One of his household came with a devastating report that points to another hindrance to faith, the "evil report."

Luke 8:49 - 50

Sometimes those closest to us can inspire the greatest fear and panic in our hearts when trying to believe God. Jairus had a choice, would he believe the Master who commanded, "Fear not," or believe the report of his family and give up in his despair. Sometimes family members will not understand our step of faith. There are times we will stand alone and even run the risk of offending loved ones and friends to press through to our miracle. When Jesus came to the house, He acted with complete disregard for the emotions of those that were there.

Luke 8:54-56

When we take a faith stand, we must be prepared to be misunderstood by those we may care most for. We must turn a deaf ear to the evil report no matter who it comes from. Here then, at last, is the answer Jairus dared to believe for.

He overcame the hurdle of pride and humbled himself. He steeled himself and remained patient and compassionate while Jesus ministered to the woman with the issue of blood (whose need seemed not as urgent as his); he chose to believe the word of the Master as opposed to what even those closest to him had to say. He stood in faith regardless of what friends and family thought, and his miracle came forth.

This story is a useful example for every one of us when we are called to stand and believe for a miracle. God is no respecter of persons (Acts 10:34), but He is a respecter of faith. Therefore, if we will do with our faith what Jairus did with his faith, we will get the same results.

Matthew 22:39 - Galatians 5:14

Jesus said:

Matthew 11:28-30 KJV Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. (29) Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. (30) For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.

Jesus commanded all his disciples to take his yoke upon them and learn of him. We should be compelled to do this, not out of necessity, but willingly and with desire. There is no greater need for the born-again believer than to learn of Jesus and his perfect will in our life.

There can be many avenues of learning that are open to us. Consider the Apostle Paul, who was taught at the foot of Gamaliel concerning the law of Moses. may rest upon me. (10) Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then am I strong.

Romans 5:3-5 KJV And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience; (4) And patience, experience; and experience, hope: (5) And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us.


